Scholars have long wondered why Jews who number less than one quarter of one percent of the world have had such a profound influence on almost every field of human endeavor.

Perhaps it all goes back to the very beginning of the birth of our people and the Passover holiday that we will shortly be celebrating.

Passover conveys five major concepts that became our mantras for how to lead successful and productive lives. They are the five most important things to know about Passover and to incorporate into every day of the rest of the year. They are our greatest contributions to the world and can be summarized in five words: memory, optimism, faith, family, and responsibility.

MEMORY - Remember is a biblical mandate that had never seemed important to anyone else before the Jewish people.

OPTIMISM - Without hope they (the Israelites) would have been lost.

FAITH - (Judaism has) a firmly held belief that we are blessed with support from above by a caring God. And that faith in a personal God gives us faith in ourselves, in our future, and in our ability to help change the world.

FAMILY - The way to perfect the world is to begin with our own families. Children are our future. They are the ones who most require our attention.
