John Adams – Our 2ND President

Born: 10/30/1735

Died: 7/4/1826 (age 90)

John Adams was an American statesman and Founding Father, who served as the first Vice-President of the U.S. and the second President. He was a lawyer, diplomat, and a leader of the movement for American independence from Great Britain.

Adams was also known for his colorful correspondence with his wife Abigail, whom he married in 1764. Abigail was surely his closest advisor.

Adams was a diplomat to France in 1778 and again in 1782. During his second trip, he helped to create the Treaty of Paris, which ended the American Revolution.

Interestingly, Adams was the only president of the first five U.S. presidents NOT to be a slaveholder. He was the first lawyer-president and the first president to live in the White House.

At the time, whichever Presidential candidate received the most votes became President, and the one with the second most votes became the Vice-President. That is how John Adams wound up with his political rival, Thomas Jefferson, as his Vice-President following the election of 1796.

John Adams and his son, John Quincy Adams (6th president), are one of only two father/son duos to both be president. The other such set are the Bushes.
