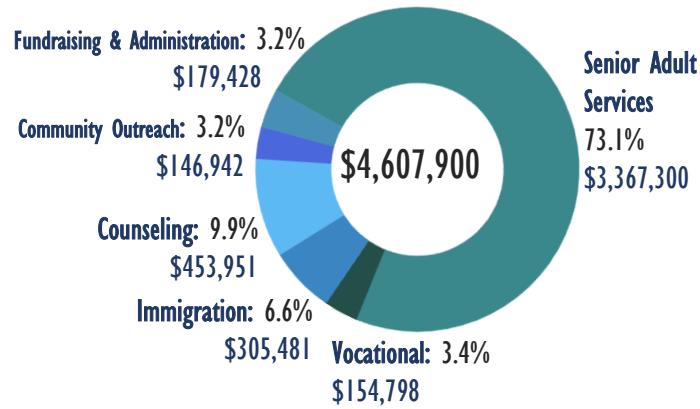

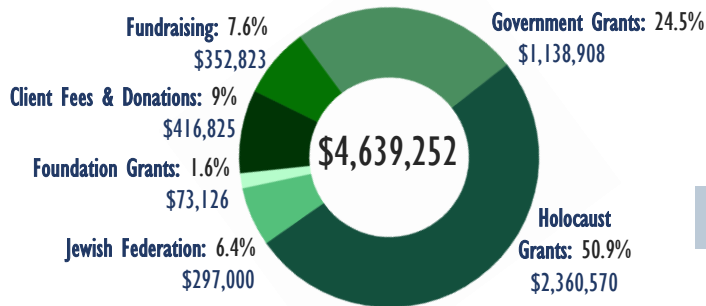

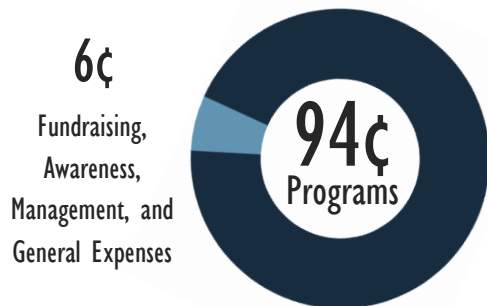
Agency Expenses
