What a busy year 2022 turned out to be at JFS! As we shook off the effects of the pandemic, we brought all our programs back to the enthusiastic appreciation of our community. Senior meal programs flourished with new locations and programs, immigration and citizenship applications multiplied as the world reopened, Holocaust survivors returned to monthly lunch programs, and new visitors to JFS discovered essential services like the kosher food pantries, mental health counseling and job search assistance. As always, the dedicated staff and volunteers of JFS continued to serve our community with dignity and respect.

In 2022:

- 36,508 kosher meals were delivered to homebound seniors
- 5,603 bags of kosher food were distributed to local families
- 4,348 counseling sessions helped those facing trauma, anxiety and depression
- 207 jobseekers participated in Women's/Career Center workshops for self-improvement
- 190 Holocaust survivors received critical services to live safely at home
- 243 immigrants fulfilled their dreams of U.S. citizenship

We are so excited for 2023 and the new opportunities coming our way. With the loyal support of our funders, volunteers and community partners we are ready for new challenges. Together we improve lives. Thank you for your support and we wish you good health and happiness.






